Admission qualification

Students who have completed **12 years** of school education, and have **qualification for admission to college in their home country**, and whose Japanese level is above **N5** in the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) or equivalent.

Application period

- 2020 April Entrance by the deadline, October 30th, 2019
2020 July Entrance by the deadline, February 12th, 2020
2020 October Entrance by the deadline, May 6th, 2020
2021 January Entrance by the deadline, August 26th, 2020
